Dear Mr. Rutledge:

It has recently come to my attention that the current agreement between Univision and Cablevision regarding the carriage of WXTV Univision 41 will expire the end of this month and that Cablevision has not entered into a new agreement with Univision for the carriage of such critical programming. I now write to urge Cablevision to do everything within its power to ensure that a new agreement is promptly reached so as to ensure that this major source of news programming to the Hispanic community will continue to be available without interruption.

Univision is the leading Spanish-language media company in the country. There are approximately 4.3 million Hispanics in the City, most of whom rely on the Univision channel as an invaluable source for obtaining news. Indeed, WXTV Univision 41 in New York was the second ranked station in the country during the first quarter of this year for early evening newscasts among all adults between the ages of 18 and 49, and the number one station in the New York market during that same period.

It is therefore imperative that Cablevision take all the necessary steps to negotiate a new agreement with Univision and ensure that such a vital resource continue to be made available to all of Cablevision's New York City subscribers, including the many Hispanic residents who so heavily rely on that resource.
